**49.25 κομάω**: to wear long hair as part of one's attire—'to have long hair, to appear with long hair, to wear long hair.' γυνὴ δὲ ἐὰν κομῷ δόξα αὐτῇ ἐστιν 'if a women wears long hair, it is a pride for her' 1 Cor 11:15. In a number of languages it may be necessary to translate κομάω as 'to let one's hair grow long' or 'not to cut one's hair.'

## Louw-Nida

**2863. κομάω komáō**; contracted komṓ, fut. komḗsō, from kómē (2864), hair. To have long hair (1 Cor. 11:14, 15). Paul teaches that a woman's hair ought to be different from a man's, and that a woman's hair is equivalent to a *peribólaion* (4018), something that is wrapped around, a veil or mantle. From the context, it seems that the woman's hair ought to be distinct from a man's hair, not only in length, but also in ornamentation.
